

GOPHER POISONING
WILL CONTINUE

Gopher poisoning on a district basis has been completed in Malheur county this fall with many farmers reporting highly satisfactory results as kills have ranged as high as 95 per cent the first time over. Petitions are in circulation to have this district plan extended to other areas next year. The work was carried on with the cooperation of the county court which supplied a revolving fund, and was supervised by the county agent. Landowners paid only the actual cost of covering their own fields, which varied to the severity of the infestation.
