**CROSS STATE RAIL  
CASE AT CONCLUSION**

Portland—The celebrated Oregon cross-state railroad case appeared to have been brought to a conclusion Monday with the ruling of the United States supreme court that the Union Pacific railroad cannot be forced to construct 185 miles of lines from Crane to Crescent Lake.  
The Oregon contest, railroad men here said, probably will become famous as a "leading case" inasmuch as it was regarded as being more embracing than any previous test of the construction provision of the transport transportation act.
