OLD LICENSE PLATES EXPIRE LAST OF JUNE
As the time approaches for new auto licenses, Secretary of State Hal E. Hoss has sent to car owners instructions for proceedings under the laws as changed by the recent legislature.

First—Use your registration card for an application blank as usual, filling out the information on the back.
Second—The rate on private passenger cars is \$5 flat, regardless of weight for the period from July 1 to December 31, making this a six months' license.

Third—In January you will be licensed again at the \$5 rate, which will give you a license good for the full year of 1934.
Fourth—Trucks will pay as usual on a weight basis; see instruction sheet for schedule of fees.
