TO THE WATER USERS OF THE CITY OF NYSSA
Users of high pressure water for irrigation are notified that the City Council has divided the city into two zones with main street as the dividing line. Those living south of main street will have the use of the water on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays; those living north of main street on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Both

zones may use it on Sundays.
The hours for irrigating are limited to from 5 o'clock p. m. to 9 o'clock p. m. on all days.
All irrigating must be done with sprinklers.
These regulations go into effect at once and apply to high pressure only. Low pressure may be used at any and all times as before.
Water users are further notified that the water will be turned off if they do not keep their water bills paid in full.
