We have quite a camp with a mess-hall 150 feet long, bath house, hospital tent and commissary. It's regular army life, minus the military training for which healthful outdoor work in the forest has been substituted. We get our clothes, three square meals a day, medical care and \$5 a month with the rest for the folks at home. We don't work to hard so everything is rosy at Camp Bates.

Our boys are scattered about. Henry Hatch is driving truck. Friday he left for Vancouver to get a new truck for Camp Bates. Bob Kaylor and Harold Brooks were sent to Baker with a carpenter gang of fifteen to build a supply house. Keith Parkinson is working with a road gang on Dixie mountain. Carleton Irwin is with the trail gang and I am back at my old stand as the blacksmith's helper.

We'd like to see friends from Nyssa they make a drive over the John Day. Camp Bates is located near Miller's Station about 12 miles east of Dixie mountain.

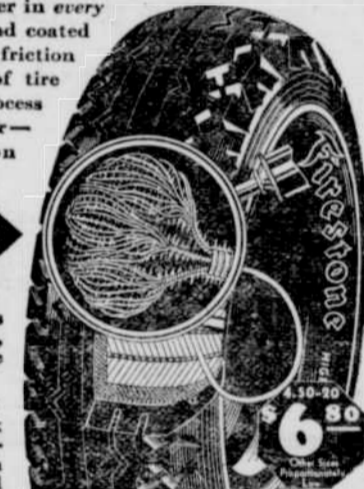
