ORDINANCE NO. 213

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS MAY BE NEEDED FOR CARRYING OUT THE TERMS OF CHAPTER 156, GENERAL LAWS OF OREGON, 1933, ENTITLED AS FOLLOWS:

"TO PROVIDE A METHOD FOR THE REFUNDING OF CERTAIN OBLIGATIONS OF INCORPORATED CITIES AND DECLARING EMERGENCIES."

Whereas, there are outstanding, due and unpaid, water bonds of the Town of Nyssa, County of Malheur, State of Oregon, in the sum of Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000.00) together with accrued interest thereon, and

WHEREAS, the said Town of Nyssa proposes, by ordinance, to refund said outstanding bonds, as provided in said Chapter 156, General Laws of Oregon, 1933, as provided and conditioned in said Chapter 156

THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF NYSSA DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: That the rules and regulations for carrying out the terms of said act shall be the same as provided by and in an act to incorporate the Town of Nyssa, enacted by the Twenty-second Regular Session Legislative Assembly, 1903, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State Feb. 24, 1903.

Passed by the Common Council of the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, by a unanimous vote of all the members elected thereto and approved by the Mayor of said Town of Nyssa, this 5th day of July, at a regular meeting thereof.

ORDINANCE NO. 214

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF TOWN OF NYSSA, OREGON, REFUNDING WATER BONDS IN THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF \$19,000.00, PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS AND OF THE COUPONS ATTACHED THERE-TO AND FOR THE SALE OR EXCHANGE OF SAID BONDS FOR OUTSTANDING WATER BONDS OF SAID TOWN, WHICH MATURED MAY 1, 1933, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

WHEREAS, on May 1st, 1933, pursuant to Ordinance No. 145, passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor of said Town of Nyssa, on the 19th day of March, 1933, as author-

ized by amendments to the charter of said Town of Nyssa, adopted on the 3rd day of March, 1933, the said Town of Nyssa issued \$20,000.00 of water bonds of Nyssa, Oregon, 1933, which said bonds were in denominations of \$1000.00 each, and were numbered consecutively from 1 to 20 inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, on the 1st day of November, and May of each and every year, and which said bonds ran for a period of twenty years from said date, and of which \$19,000.00 were outstanding and matured on May 1st, 1933, and on said last mentioned date were due and unpaid, and

WHEREAS, there are no funds on hand in the treasury of said Town of Nyssa to apply in payment of the principal of any of said bonds.

THE PEOPLE OF NYSSA ORDAIN: Section 1. That there be issued \$19,000.00 of refunding water bonds of the Town of Nyssa, by virtue of this ordinance and as authorized by Chapter 156, Oregon Laws, 1933, for the purpose of refunding a like amount of water bonds of said Town issued on the 1st day of May, 1933, which said bonds became due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1933. The said refunding water bonds shall be in the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, shall be dated May 1, 1933, shall mature in installments of \$1,000.00 each, on May 1 of each of the years 1935 to 1953 inclusive, and shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually in May 1 and November 1 of each year. The said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and City Recorder, and the coupons attached thereto shall bear the facsimile signatures of said officers. The principal of and the interest on such bonds shall be payable at the office of the city treasurer of Nyssa and the bonds shall be numbered 1 to 19 inclusive and be in substantially the following form:

The Town of Nyssa in the County of Malheur and State of Oregon, for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer the sum of

ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS on the first day of May, with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons there-fore hereto attached as they respectively mature, both principal and interest being payable at the office of the City Treasurer in Nyssa, Oregon.

This bond is one of a series of like date and tenor, except as to maturity and is issued as a part of a total issue of \$19,000.00 of such bonds for the purpose of refunding a like amount of water bonds of said Town, due May 1, 1933, which were issued by virtue and in pursuance of Ordinance No. 145, duly passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on the 19th day of March, 1933; and it is hereby certified that every requirement of the constitution and laws of the State of Oregon has been duly complied with in the issuance hereof, and that this bond is within every debt and other limitation prescribed by the constitution and laws of the State of Oregon and by the charter of said Town.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, has caused this bond to be signed by its Mayor and countersigned by its Recorder under the corporate seal of said Town and the interest coupons attached hereto to bear the engraved facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Recorder, all as of the first day of May, 1933.

Section 3. The recorder is hereby authorized and instructed to advertise said bonds for sale at a special meeting of the Council to be held on the 7th day of August, 1933, by publication of notice of such sale once each week for two successive weeks immediately prior to said meeting in a weekly newspaper of general circulation published in Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, said notice to provide that the bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, that they shall be sold to the highest responsible bidder, that bids for the

purchase of said bonds shall be accompanied by a certified check in favor of the Town of Nyssa for two per cent of par value of said bonds and that the Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to sell all or any part of the bonds.

Section 4. In the event that the Council does not receive a satisfactory bid or bids for said refunding bonds, the Mayor and Recorder shall, if possible, cause said bonds to be exchanged par value for par value for said water bonds maturing May 1, 1933, pursuant to agreements entered into between the said Mayor and Recorder acting in behalf of said Town of Nyssa and the holders of said outstanding water bonds.

Section 5. WHEREAS, it is essential that the outstanding water bonds of the Town of Nyssa which matured on May 1, 1933, be refunded, redeemed and retired without delay through sale of the aforesaid refunding bonds, or through exchange thereof for the matured bonds, and it is therefore necessary for the peace, health, safety and credit of the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, that this ordinance take effect immediately.

An emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Common Council of the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, by the unanimous vote and by the consent of all the members elected thereto being present and voting, and approved by the Mayor of said Town this 6th day of July, 1933.
