



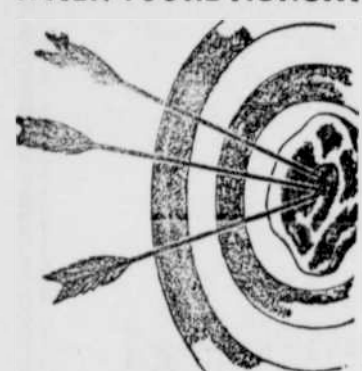

TURKEY CROP WILL BE LESS

MALHEUR DECREASE IS ESTIMATED AT 15 PER CENT UNDER 1932 CROP.

In the season's first survey of the turkey situation, a decrease in the crop of holiday birds ranging from 25 to 50 per cent is reported. The decrease is heaviest in Idaho and Oregon, the report indicates, due largely to the low record prices paid in 1932.

A decrease of 15 per cent is estimated for Malheur county, one of the leading turkey producing counties in the state. An increase of 15 per cent is reported for Klamath due largely to the fact that turkeys have been imported to wipe out an invasion of grasshoppers in that area.

Hatches were poor this spring, says the survey, and difficulties in brooding were responsible for a considerable loss.

Considering the shortage in the northwest, which may be a reflection of the general showing in the country, there is hope among growers of betterment in the price situation.

Ralph Weaver, employe of the state highway commission and a crew of 12 men are located in Burns making preparations to complete the survey of the last uncompleted link of the Central Oregon highway. They recently completed surveying a stretch from Drinkwater pass to Nigger flat, near Drewsey. When completed to Burns, the survey of the entire road to Burns will be finished.

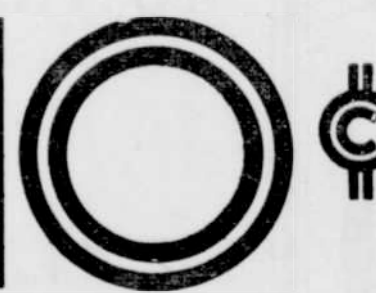
