GOODYEAR ADDS TO POWER EQUIPMENT

During the next few months, Goodyear will spend more than a half million dollars in purchase of new power plant equipment and building, representing one of the largest major construction improvements in the Akron area.

A portion of the present power plant building, back of the general office buildings, is to be torn down and six boilers, some of which have been in service since 1910, will be dismantled.

The building itself, of conventional brick-steel construction, will cost approximately \$20,000 and will provide employment for 100 men during the course of erection.
