MALHEUR GOLD PRODUCTION LOW

Malheur county broke into the gold production records for Oregon for 1932 with production worth \$7950, the report Monday from the U. S. bureau of mines disclosed. Jackson county lead with gold valued at \$147,924. Grant county produced precious minerals valued at \$82,265; Baker \$58,353.

Oregon's total production was \$415,617 in 1932 as compared with \$319,703 in 1931.

The mining industry is feeling the surge of new life with the government's decision to permit the sale of gold abroad at increased profits.

NOTICE OF GOPHER CONTROL DISTRICT

FIRST notice is hereby given by the County Court of Malheur County that all land owners within the following described district, to-wit:

Owyhee District No. 6.
Beginning at the SW corner of Section 31, Township 20 S., Range 46 E., W. M.; running thence due north one quarter of a mile to the NW corner of SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 31; thence due east to the NW corner of the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 31; thence north to the NW corner of the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 31; thence due east to the NW corner of the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 29; thence due east to the NW corner of the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 28; thence due north to the NW corner of the SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 28; thence due east to the NE corner of the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 28; thence due south to the SE corner of the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 28; thence due east to the NE corner of the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 27; thence due south to the NE corner of the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 27; thence due south to the SE corner of the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 27; thence due east to the SE corner of the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 27; thence following along the west bank of the Owyhee River in a southwesterly direction to a point where the Owyhee River intersects the southern boundary of Section 31, Township 20, S., Range 46 E., W. M.; thence due west to the place of beginning, and all within Malheur County, State of Oregon, shall begin in good faith to eradicate or destroy pocket gophers, within thirty days of publication of this notice, by the following or any other effective method:

Poisoning Pocket Gophers in Malheur County

Mixing the Bait
Mix one ounce strychnine alkaloid with one-eighth ounce saccharine. Dust over 16 quarts of sweet potatoes, carrots or parsnips. These baits are peeled and cut into 1-2 inch by 2 inches pieces and thoroly dusted with the above mixture.

Placing the Bait
In placing the bait the runway of the gopher may be opened by means of a shovel or garden trowel, digging from the mound into main runway of the gopher, there placing one piece of this bait. In heavier soils and in irrigated sections, these baits may be placed by means of a probe. When the probe is used do not probe closer than six inches to the mound so that the main runway will be located. After the runway is located, remove the probe, placing one piece of bait in the runway. Place a covering over the holes to shut out the light. Care should be taken not to let any loose dirt fall

on the bait; cover with clod or grass to prevent this. Effective poisoning cannot be obtained if any light penetrates the gopher runway. If the ground is thoroughly poisoned three times, with intervals of about ten days between poisonings, better than ninety per cent kill's should be obtained.

CAUTION

All unclean utensils used in preparation of poisons and all poison containers should be kept plainly labeled and out of reach of children, irresponsible persons, and livestock. Any unused bait should be burned. The land owners failing to comply with the above order shall be entered upon by person or persons appointed by the County Court to eradicate and destroy pocket gophers on any such lands within the above described districts.

The cost of such work consisting of poison bait material and labor shall be held by the county as a lien upon the property treated by the person or persons appointed by the County Court.

Lands within the regularly organized District, Oregon Trail No. 4, will also be treated.
