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PREDATORY ANIMAL FUND IS RESTORED

Good news for the stockmen and ranchers is the report from Washington that instead of reducing the budget of \$582,741 for federal control of predatory animals and rodents, the federal biological survey service will continue this work in Oregon and the

other 19 western states on a normal basis.

Congressman Walter M. Pierce, former stockman of La Grande, was one of a delegation of western members of congress who campaigned to maintain this appropriation for predatory animal control.

Stockmen feared the abandonment of this service as it saves them its full cost and much more in sheep, cattle and farm stock.

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THE NEW DOLLAR

With the President's signature affixed to it, the much debated monetary bill has become a new law. The dollar has been devaluated. While some economists have protested any change others, among them some master financiers of the country, have given the dollar devaluation program their approval.

So far as the average of us is concerned little immediate change will be noticeable—a dollar will continue to be a dollar. If, as expected by the sponsors of the monetary change and President Roosevelt, commodity prices are to increase the upturn will be welcomed by all producers. A raise in farm products will help all of us as it is the sole means of increasing the purchasing power of the farmers.
