

DEATH CLAIMS OWYHEE MATRON

**M R S. MARGARET SCHWEIZER
DIES IN ONTARIO AFTER LONG
ILLNESS; BURIED AT OWYHEE
CEMETERY.**

Mrs. Margaret Schweizer, pioneer matron of the Owyhee farming community near Nyssa, died in Ontario Thursday, February 15, after an illness of several years. She was born in Wisconsin April 2, 1869. In 1889 she was married to Gus A. Schweizer and soon after they came west, locating in the Owyhee where they were among the first settlers. They resided on their home ranch until Mr. Schweizer's death 12 years ago, when Mrs. Schweizer moved to Ontario.

Surviving are six children, Mrs. Bertha Green and Mrs. Cora Glascock of Ontario, Wm. Schweizer and Mrs. Anna Hite of Owyhee, Carl Schweizer and Kate Nannary of Seattle, all of whom were with her at the time of her death. Funeral services were conducted from the Owyhee schoolhouse last Tuesday afternoon Rev. C. C. Hovda officiating. Mrs. Schweizer was buried in the family plot in Owyhee cemetery. The bereaved relatives have the sympathy of many Owyhee and Nyssa friends.

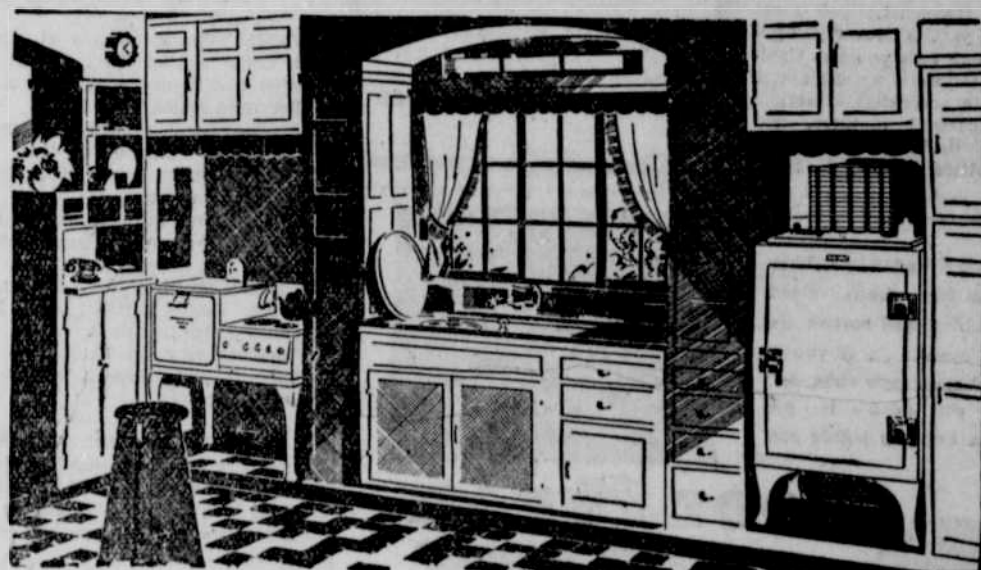
