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FARM CREDIT OFFICE OPENS

The Production Credit association is ready to receive applications for loans. The office for Malheur county and ten Idaho counties was opened Monday in Caldwell by E. Q. Marsing, manager. The organization was formed under the national farm credit administration and will serve farmers who need crop production loans. Pieter Tensen of Nyssa is Malheur county director.

"This association is purely an agri-

cultural co-operative organization which was organized under the direction of the farm credit administration by farmer who are borrowers or eligible to become borrowers, none others having membership privileges," Marsing said.

"Loans will be made for production purposes and the organization is designed to be permanent.

"Loans on land and improvements which come under the federal land

bank division or range livestock loans above \$7500 initial loan or \$10,000 including budgets will not be handled by the association.

"This is not a temporary relief measure but is established to function as a permanent agency for the purpose of financing agriculture in the future. Therefore it is charged with the responsibility of taking care of agricultural needs except loans on lands or improvements which come under the Federal Land Bank division and range livestock loans above \$7500 initial loan or \$10,000 including budgets, which is included in the range livestock organization.
