

MENDENHALL SEES BOOGEY IN TAX

Owyhee Dam, April 7.—(To the Journal)—Let's take the "T" out of the sales tax.

All Malheur county business men may rest assured that a large percentage of their business will go to Idaho if it became a law. Then, again, let's see what it will cost a family per annum. It would be lawful to add 1 per cent per quart of milk alone. If a family consumed 2 quarts per day, the tax might cost them \$7.30 on milk alone.

This tax will have to be added to the consumer cost or deducted from the producer. It will be added to the light bill and so on down the line. When fully traced I believe this tax money would go to Wall street to pay interest on school bonds.

We want our teachers paid a fair salary, we want good schools but we do not want class legislation in the form of exempting the very wealthy owning bank and government stocks and bonds and adding a sales tax to the farmer, laborer and near indigent. We must defeat the sales tax and place a tax on stocks and bonds.

Shall we have the dog wag the tail or the tail wag the dog? In other words is a member of our legislature the servant of the sovereign people or master? If we of Oregon have a government of, by and for the people instead of for the wealthy then this sales tax ghost when buried once by popular vote would have remained dead.

There is this about the sales tax—it might do something toward the establishment of "self respect of the poor through their share in maintenance of government" but Mr. Sales Taxpayer would not be a fulfilled

vote even if his year tax cost him \$30. If the present school tax cannot be borne by the power companies, railroads, stocks, bonds and banks—why are the utilities so opposed to selling out to Uncle Sam.
