Whistler became famous as an early American artist. With him during his ardent years of study was his mother. She was visiting in North Carolina when the Civil War broke out. Relatives told her it was impossible for her to return to London where her son had established himself. Somehow she arranged to take passage on a Confederate blockade runner and on it she arrived safely in England. There she lived to the end of her days, the inseparable companion of the man who came to be hailed as one of the greatest painters in the world.
