GRANGE HITS SALES TAX

FIFTH MEASURE ON REFERENDUM BALLOT IS SALES TAX; GILL LEADS FIGHT AGAINST IT.

5 School Relief Sales Tax. Nos 308 and 309 on Ballot.

Fearing that the sales tax would prove of little benefit for the relief of schools and is a bait to really head off or repeal state income taxes paid by the rich, Ray Gill is leading the fight against the measure in Oregon. He states:

1. A national movement is sponsored to reduce property taxes paid by the wealthy and head off incomes taxes. A desperate drive has been made to set up the sales tax in Oregon, first on one excise, then on the present one.
2. The people rejected the first sales tax but the legislature passed the present measure and then refused to refer it to the people. The grange sponsored the referendum.
3. The sales tax would levy upon nec-

essities such as food and clothing. Who will benefit? The large property owners. A summary says the utilities of Oregon will save \$606,502. The farmers will carry a double burden. They will be taxed on living expenses and purchases for the operation of their farms.

4. The distribution of sales tax revenue is so worded in the law that many school districts will be compelled to put on extra teachers or lose part of their proposed receipts.

5. Schools are in better shape. Heavy payments of delinquent taxes have come in. The government came to the relief of really distressed schools.

6. The grange is working for school aid but will not support a sales tax.
