

## Farm Women Invited To Summer Camp

Mrs. Karl Norvall, Pomona grange lecturer, has a new project for this summer. She is sponsoring a vacation camp for farm women—open to all farm women whether they are grange

members or not. Grant and Baker counties will join with Malheur and women of nearby Idaho communities will be welcomed.

If present plans mature, a three day camp will be held on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, previous to the tri-county grange picnic the second Sunday in August, in the Unity vicinity. School buses will take the campers from Vale at a small cost while trucks will carry provisions and equipment. Different groups will do kitchen police. Every minute of each day will be planned full to overflowing with good

things. Recreational, educational and inspirational periods will precede a nice long rest each day. Corvallis extension service will send a recreational leader. Miss Marion Hepworth, demonstration leader from the University of Idaho, will be invited.

"We hope that a great deal of good may result from our farm women getting together for this three-day period and that each will return home inspired with higher ideals and new vigor to take up again the duties of the women of the soil."

### MONOXIDE GAS IS

#### MENACE AT WHEEL

Drowsiness at the wheel, blamed for many automobile accidents, is often caused by the presence of carbon monoxide gas within the body of the car, according to the National Safety Council.

Tests have disclosed that 60 per cent of automobiles while in operation contain measurable concentrations of carbon monoxide, and 7 per cent of the cars contain quantities of the gas "that may cause collapse and directly increase the probability of serious accidents if drivers are exposed to the dangerous atmosphere four or more hours."

Poor maintenance of automobiles is one of the contributing causes of carbon monoxide concentration, the tests showed.

They shouldn't all be punished the same way. One may need to be spanked and a dozen others may need something else.
