**4-H Clubbers
Have Big Time
In Corvallis**

Oregon State College, Corvallis, June 18—Among the nearly 800 club members and 60 leaders attending the twentieth annual 4-H club summer school on the campus here are three boys, six girls and two leaders from Malheur county. This is the largest summer school ever held in Oregon.

The boys at summer school live in the college men's dormitory, and the girls occupy two women's halls, Waldo and Kidder. They spend their mornings attending classes and their afternoons, following daily assembly, in athletics and other forms of supervised recreation. Their evenings are full, with parties, pictures, local talent shows and similar entertainment. A number of new classes have been added this year and are meeting with great favor among the clubbers.

Special programs, usually featuring some prominent citizen or citizens of the state as speakers, are arranged for each assembly. These programs are broadcast for the benefit of parents, friends and the thousands of members over the state who are unable to participate in summer school. Each county delegation also broadcasts over station KOAC between 7 and 7:45 o'clock in the evening at some time during the two weeks' session.

Self-government is the rule at the school, with the boys and the girls having separate executive bodies. Irene Eter of Pilot Rock is president of the girls and Ivan Bierly of Washington county is chairman of the Boys' Executive committee.

Malheur club members present are Doris Klingback, Evelyn Haworth, Virgil Smith and James Nichols, Nyssa; Mildred Swanson and Larna Gale, Harper; Martha Godwin, Big Bend, and Gene Stewart and Paul Kirby, Ontario. Leaders from Malheur are E. M. Hauser, assistant county agent, and Elsie Walter.

IDAHO PLANS RABBIT DRIVE

Idaho is going after a surplus of five million rabbits in 34 southern counties. Already more than 10,000 citizens have registered for the drive. Fences will be erected in semi-circles several hundred feet wide. The army with shovels, clubs and sticks will walk in single file over an assigned territory and corner the rabbits in the semicircle where they will be killed. \$35,000 has been appropriated for the drive.
