MORMON BASIN MINE PRODUCES

Three car loads of concentrates from the Condor Mines of Mormon Basin, southeast of Baker, will represent the production of the flotation machines in the mill. This is in addition to several thousands of dollars recovered from the amalgamating plates during the month. The recovery of gold has been made from ore left on the mine dumps during the operations of the Rainbow mine years ago when a production of \$3,000,000 was made. At that time the ore was too low grade to be treated at a profit. Today with gold worth \$35 an ounce and improved metallurgical processes make it possible to treat the ore at a profit.

JAPAN IN THE BIBLE
