Washington—Senator Borah of Idaho has held an extended conference with Dr. F. E. Townsend, father of the old age pension plan. Townsend discussed in detail his plan and the methods by which he proposes to finance old age pensions.

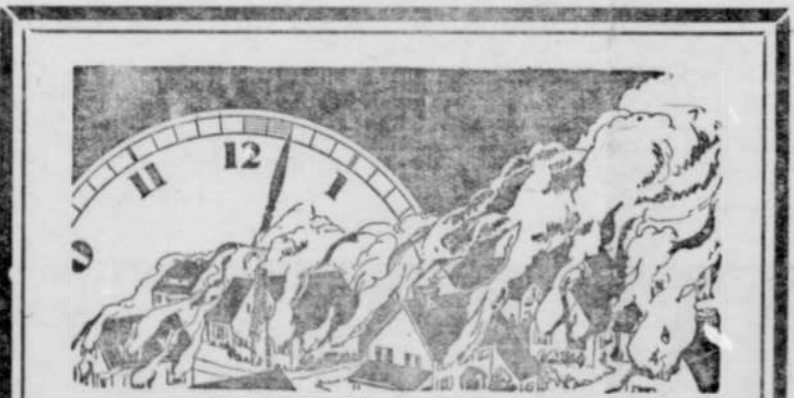
The only point of difference that arose between them was over the method of finance. Doctor Townsend advocating a federal sales tax of one and a half per cent, to which Borah does not subscribe.

Borah found Townsend a quite a different type than he had anticipated—calm, deliberate, studious and in no sense of radical mein or speech. Townsend said he would give consideration to Borah's criticism of his plan, and promised to call on the senator again in a few days. In the meantime, he will investigate alternate plans of financing old age pensions.
