

Oregon Men Not Awed By Mussolini's Test Yields

High yields of grain, such as the 131 bushels of wheat per acre reported in Italy on Mussolini's test farms, are not out of the ordinary experimentally and do not necessarily forecast marked increases in nation-wide or even state-wide production, says G. R. Hyslop, head of the division of plant industries at Oregon State college.

Oregon, in fact, can lay claim to almost equally phenomenal yields on an experimental basis, and while these are of real value, they are not upsetting the balance of production but are aiding individuals and communities to develop a more profitable agriculture, he says.

"Irrigated Federation wheat on the Burns branch experiment station produced at the rate of 102.3 bushels in 1934," says Professor Hyslop. "Markton oats, introduced by the Moro branch station, made a yield at Burns of 150 bushels per acre. Trebi and OAC No. 7 barleys, also introduced by the experiment station, yielded 120.4 and 119.6 bushels per acre respectively.

"Quite a number of wheat yields in excess of 90 bushels per acre and barley yields in excess of 100 bushels were obtained at Burns last season. The same experimental station is showing, however, that excellent yields of alfalfa, seed potatoes and various forage crops may be obtained there under irrigation, and may be marketed more advantageously than wheat.

"Such research enabled the nation and state to increase its production of wheat so markedly during the world war and contributed much to winning that great struggle. It is now developing new things just as assiduously in order to enable farmers to find profitable outlet for their labor that will not add to the present wheat surplus.

RAY GARRISON ASSISTANT TEACHER IN AGRICULTURE AT OREGON STATE COLLEGE

Ray Garrison, senior in agriculture, is doing part time teaching in the Agricultural Engineering department of the school of Agriculture. Garrison has charge of the laboratory work in the farm equipment repair course, and is laboratory assistant in the introductory agricultural engineering course given to freshmen. The regular teaching staff is unable to handle these classes due to the increased enrollment and demand for these courses.


