TEACHERS TO MEET AT LA GRANDE

The annual conference of teachers and school executives located in the eastern part of the state is scheduled for La Grande on March 30th. ABLE SPEAKER TO APPEAR IN ONTARIO

Alden G. Alley of Washington D. C., associate secretary of the National Council for the Prevention of War, will speak in the Ontario high school auditorium Tuesday evening, April 9, at a joint meeting of all organizations interested in the furtherance of world peace in the lower Snake river valley. The meeting is being held under the auspices of the local anti-war committees of Vale, Ontario, Nyssa, Payette, Weiser and New Plymouth, and the Snake river valley ministerial asso-

ciation. Mr. Alley is now on a speaking tour that is taking him over a large part of the United States. He has attended ten sessions of the League of Nations and spent the past summer in Germany observing the Nazi regime. Mr. Alley is a graduate of Harvard university and a former professor of history at Dana College.

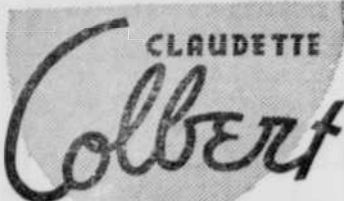

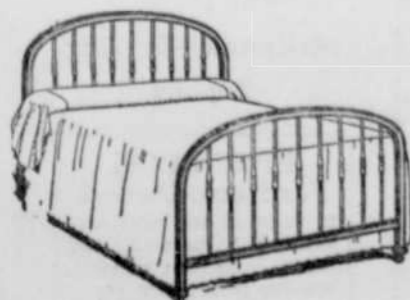
