Using Honey

At this season most of us are busy preparing foods to use next winter. Here are two uses of honey that are especially fine.

Honey Dried Corn

Take fresh corn just right for the table and cut from the ears. Take 16 cups, (1 gallon) of corn and add 1 cup of honey 1 cup of cream and 4 tbs. salt. Cook till thick and about done, stirring constantly, as it will scorch easily. Spread on pie pans and dry in a very slow oven till it looks glazed or shiny. Spread on trays and leave in the sun from 4 to 12 hours, depending on the day. Cover with cheese cloth or netting. The kernels will be very dry and separate. Store in small flour sack in a dry place. Just soak in water and cook to serve.

Bread and Butter Pickles

1 quart of cucumbers cut fine; Let stand 2 hours in salt and then drain. Scald together: 1 cup honey; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup vinegar; 1 teap. mustard seed; a few cloves 1 t. celery seed. 1 t. turmeric. Pour on cucumbers. Boil 15 minutes and seal. One bell pepper and a little onion cut fine may be added to the cucumber.

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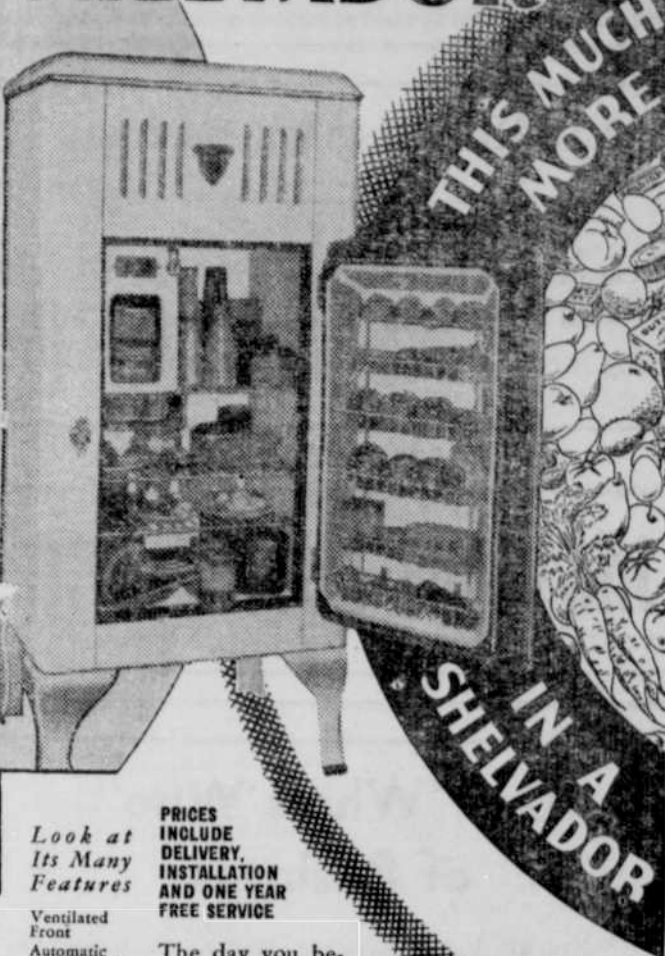
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
