Big Game To Decide Western Rose Bowl Eleven; Grayson Returns

Ninety thousand grid fans will pack the huge bowl in Palo Alto Saturday, attracted by the most important California-Stanford "Big Game" in many years.

To the victor will go the honor of representing the West in Pasadena's Rose Bowl on New Year's Day.

A California victory will protect a record unmarked by defeat thus far this season. "Stub" Allison's Golden Bears are on the threshold of a national championship, with the field of undefeated teams now narrowed down to seven as a result of last week's upsets which saw the fall of North Carolina, Marquette and Syracuse.

Stanford's hopes for victory were strengthened Saturday when Robert "Bones" Hamilton, brilliant half-back who has been on the shelf since the third week of the season, served notice that he is ready to go the route again.
