

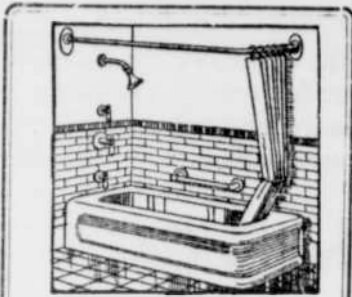
TIES FOR FIRST AS

J. E. Holly and Gene Seybold were in Boise Tuesday on business.

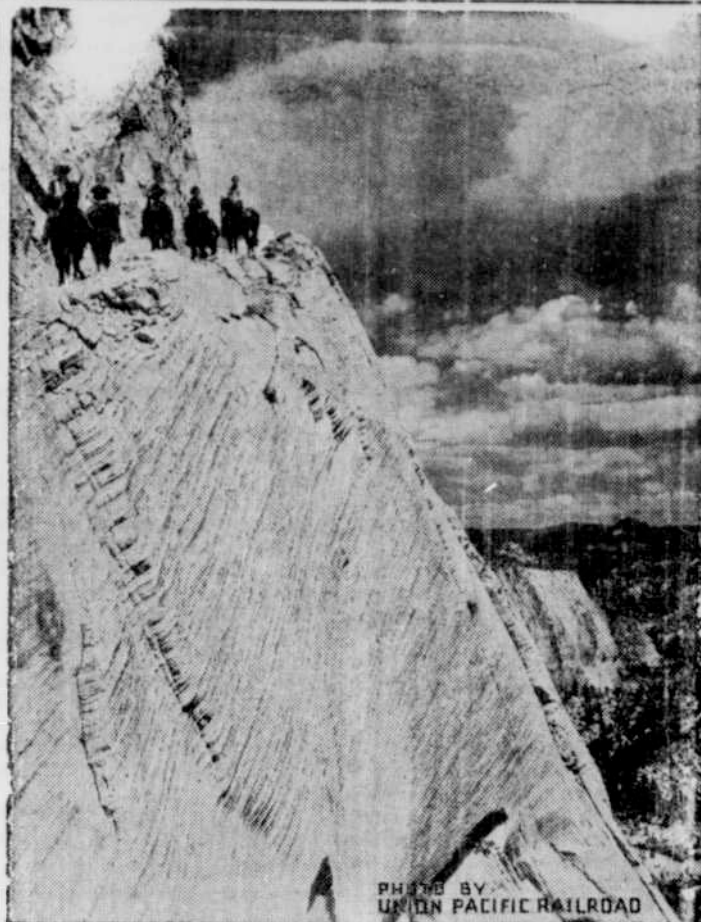

Horse Pasture Plateau was so named by the Indians who drove their stock to this inaccessible, easily defended point to protect it during intertribal warfare, and later by Mormon settlers in southern Utah who used it as a summer grazing ground.
