APRIL BRINGS THE PRIMROSE SWEET, SCATTERS DAISIES AT OUR FEET.

This is the month that Easter, the Christian spring festival commemorating the resurrection is enjoyed.

The term in the Teutonic and Anglo-Saxon language is derived from Ostara, divinity of spring to the ancient Norsemen. Congress Extends Modernizing Plan In Modified Form

Portland, Ore.—Passage of the National Housing Act amendment, extending the Modernization Credit Plan a full year, to April 1, 1937, has been completed by congress and the measure is now awaiting the president's signature, according to information received by Jamleon Parker, state FHA director.

As soon as the president has attached his signature, which housing officials believe he will do immediately, revised regulations and contracts of insurance will be issued by the Federal Housing Administration.

Important changes contained in the new amendment are: Financing of movable equipment or machinery no longer permitted for any type of property where loan for same is less than \$2,000.

In the future the borrower must either own property to be improved or hold it under lease running at least six months beyond term of loan.

Loans may be made for improved property only, thus eliminating new construction under the modernization phase of the program.

Approved financial institutions will be insured against loss up to ten per cent of their total advances, instead of 20 per cent.

Reserves already accumulated on the 20 per cent basis are not applicable to losses sustained on loans made after March 31. New reserves must be started beginning April 1, on a basis of ten per cent.

Where a question exists as to the eligibility of a loan, it is suggested that the financial institution defer final commitment until the new regulations are received.

These changes in the modernization plan do not affect the operation of the single mortgage system

or permanent phase of the Federal Housing program.
