

Loans Arranged For 120 Farm Families

Farm plans which should provide ample food and a new cash income have been worked out for 120 farm families in Malheur county, and loans arranged to provide the necessary working capital, reports Ray Garrison, rural rehabilitation supervisor. Now loans and plans are in preparation, or awaiting approval. Emergency advances are being made to 50 families for subsistence goods pending rehabilitation or return of seasonal farm employment.

Purchase of seed, farm equipment, stock and other capital goods made possible by the rehabilitation loan are being made as needed. Repair materials for fences and buildings are usually the first purchase, so that the way is prepared for poultry, pigs or cows. As spring opens up, garden seed, tools, equipment and other supplies are being bought.

Loans for seasonable supplies are written on a 2-year repayment plan or less, and loans for stock large pieces of machinery and other "recoverable" goods may be paid for over a five year period if necessary. Every loan carries 5 per cent interest and definite dates are set for repayment before the loan is ap-

proved. Not only relief families are being served but low-income farm families who are unable to borrow elsewhere may apply for loans. Under the rehabilitation plan each family is expected to reach a self-sustaining basis, repay the loan and meet other obligations.

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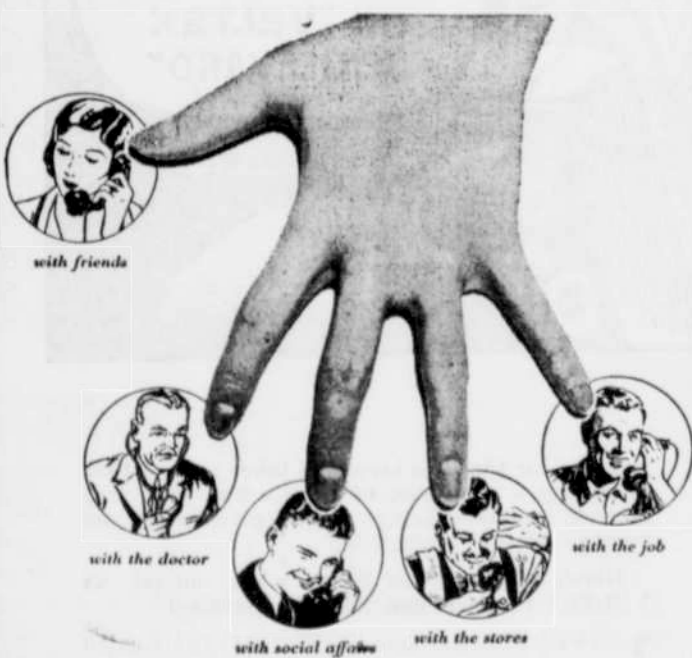
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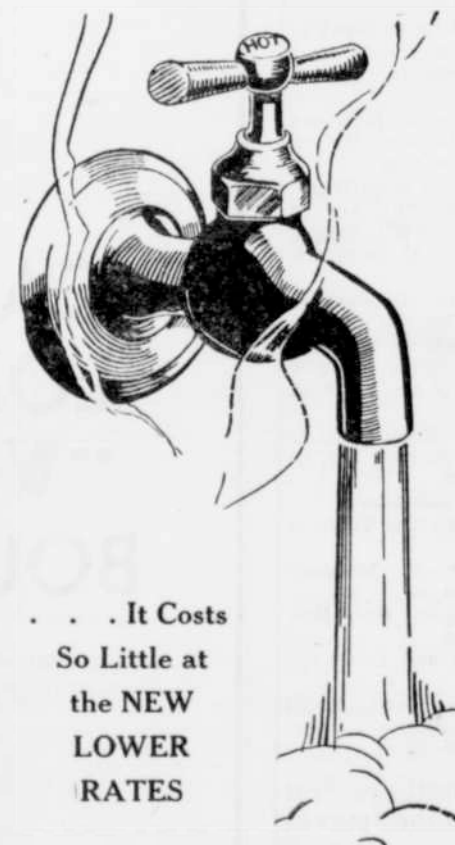

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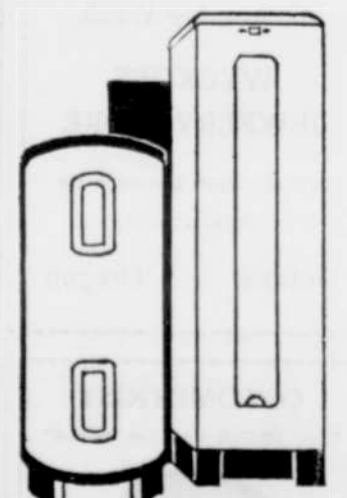
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
