PERIOD ENDS MAY 15

The CCC period of enrollment will end May 15th, according to Miss Handsaker, relief director for this county, but the Malheur county office would like to enroll all those contemplating entering the service, by May 13th. Enrollees have to go to Vale to Miss Handsaker's office above the bank to sign up.

This county has an unlimited quota and an exceptional good opportunity to get into the CCC exists now. Candidates must be between the ages of 17 and 28 years, single, with relatives or dependents on direct relief, working on W.P.A., or who have received a grant from the Rural Resettlement Administration. It is not necessary that they be on relief now but merely that they or their family have had a hard sledding and might have been on relief during the past few months. The idea is to get boys who really need these CCC jobs.
