

**TOWNSEND SPEAKER
DRAWS CAPACITY
HOUSE HERE**

Eugene Burr, Townsend speaker, held the close attention of a full house last Tuesday as he talked on the Townsend plan and the transaction tax for two hours at the Community church. He drew a wheel on the blackboard, showing how the Townsend plan would increase purchasing power, which would call for more products, and which in turn would mean more labor employed, more wages and getting right back to the start, would mean more purchasing power.

Mr. Burr claimed the Townsend

plan would save the United States 8 billions in poor house expense, 4 billion criminal expense, 3 billion other expense; to say nothing of the 5 billions or more relief expense of the government. He thought the savings under the plan would be enough to pay the Townsend pension, set at an approximate figure of 20 billions.

Mr. Burr gave several examples illustrating them on the black board to show that the transaction tax could not exceed 6 1/2 per cent if it was all handed down to the consumer, which he thought not likely. He also designated the Townsend plan as "the rich mans security and poor man's prosperity."

CONSTRUCTION WORK**

Selaled bids are to be opened at the reclamation office in Ontario on June 8th for the construction of earthwork and structures, Sage Creek main drain and other drains in the Succor Creek division of the Owyhee project. Principal items are excavation for drains and structures, backfills, pouring concrete, dry-paving, placing of reinforcement boards, driving timber piling, erecting timber in structures, laying metal pipe and erecting 284 feet of metal flume.

The excavation is the largest item, coming to 534,000 cubic yards for drains and 2,500 cubic yards of structures.
