COURT DECISION DOES NOT AFFECT REHABILITATION PROGRAM IN OREGON

Activities of the Resettlement Administration in Oregon, Washington and Idaho will continue in full despite newspaper headlines concerning its unconstitutionality, according to word received here from Harry G. Ade, acting regional director. The 4,000 families under the rehabilitation program, four land conservation projects and resettlement areas in this region are in no way affected by the lower Federal Court's decision, made on plans for a model community in Somerset County, New Jersey.

The three-to-two decision rendered by the District of Columbia Court of Appeals is limited entirely to an injunction restraining plans for a model community in New Jersey and in no way effects the program here.
