

Baker To Stage Mining Jubilee On July 3 and 4

Baker, Ore.—(Special)—Baker is fast taking on the Mining Jubilee air with such symbols as blue and gold street banners, red shirts and occasional forbidden firecrackers.

The spirit of the west will have permeated the state capitol shortly when Governor Charles H. Martin, Earl Snell, secretary of state, Rufus Holman, state treasurer, and Frank McColloch, public utilities commissioner and former Baker attorney, will receive through the mail red shirts with mandates to wear them to the Baker Jubilee—or else.

The governor and state executives will attend the state planning board's regional conference of committees on mining and geology here July 2, and the Eastern Oregon Mining and Mineral association convention July 3. The governor will address the pioneers at the city park

July 4.

Outstanding on the sports program will be the baseball game between Seneca and the Baker Miners the afternoon of July 3. The Seneca team, undefeated in two seasons' play against semi-professional teams from Bend to Burns, will be followed by several hundred fans. The Hines mill and logging camps in the Seneca section will close for the Jubilee.

The greatest collection of gold ever shown in Baker will be displayed at the First National bank from two to four p. m. July 4. In addition to gold and ore from every operation in this section, the Wells-Fargo Express company strong box in which gold was transported from Canyon City to Baker during the early and prosperous mining days in eastern Oregon will be shown.

Stage coaches, which made every mining camp in this section 50 years ago, are again being prepared for the parade July 4. More entries have already been received for this event than in previous years. Kiddies with and without pets but with an abundance of ideas are registering for the juvenile parade July 3.

Teams from Bear, Idaho, Bates, Baker and Cornucopia, Oregon, will compete for purse money in the rock drilling contest early July 4. Jack Dougherty and Ed Robertson of Bates, winners of last year's contest with a hole depth of 33½ inches, will compete again this year.

The hum of cross-cut saws is echoing in surrounding logging camps where teams are perfecting their art for the log sawing contest set for late afternoon July 4.

Well-known western characters will be dramatized in set pyrotechnic pieces interspersed with sky rockets the evening of July 4.

OREGON VETERANS WARNED

AGAINST "BONUS RACKETS"

Oregon veterans are warned to be on the look out for schemes designed to trick them out of their bonus money according to a release today by the Portland Better Business Bureau.

For months, the report states, the racketeers, the slickers and the fake stock promoters have been devising ways and means of separating three and one half million people from two and a half billion dollars of adjusted service pay. Old rackets are being dusted off and new ones created by the bunco men who hope to "cash-in" on this unprecedented distribution of funds.

It is pointed out that every veteran now becomes a "prospect" in the card index of the "get-rich-quick" promoter and every known lure of quick riches and easy money will be employed in the urgent sales effort of these business charlatans.

Particularly the veterans are urged to be wary of the "hurry-up" tactics that will be used by many of these unscrupulous promoters, for in most cases questionable deals are put over by the promoter who insists that the victim act at once, thus avoiding the possibility of an investigation that will reveal the fraud or the unsound elements in the proposition.

As a safe guard against becoming involved in losses through schemes of doubtful character, it is suggested that veterans investigate unknown offerings or deals presented by strangers through the Better Business Bureau, the Chamber of Commerce in their locality or their bank and they are advised to promptly report any bonus racket that comes to their attention.

Honey on Raspberries, Strawberries or Cherries

Drizzle honey over berries and then chill and serve. (warning honey slightly first makes it easier to drizzle or to measure.)

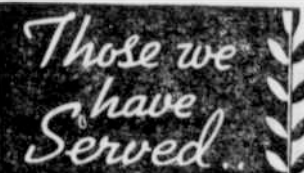
Honey Syrup for Pancakes or Waffles

Boil together one cup of brown sugar and one cup of water, then add one cup of honey and bring just to the boiling and remove from stove. Serve either hot or cold.

Honey Pineapple Nut Bread

2 T fat; 1 cup honey; 1 egg; 2½ cup flour; 1c all bran; ½c nut meats 3 tps baking powder ½ tps salt 1 c pineapple juice.

Blend fat and honey, add egg and beat well. Sift together the dry ingredients, reserving ½ cup of the flour for mixing with the nut meats. Add about half of the dry ingredients to the egg and honey mixture and blend add all-bran and pineapple juice and remaining flour and then nut meats. Stir gently, do not

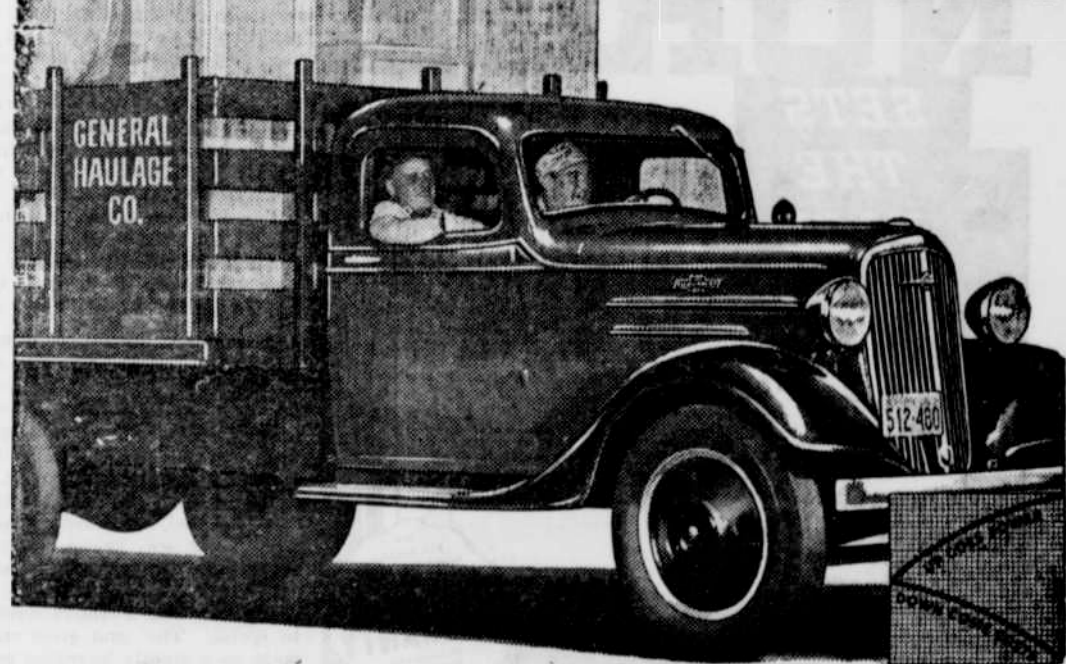
