NYSSA COMING TO FRONT AS SUGAR BEET SECTION—

WE know of no crop growing in the Nyssa section which has attracted so much favorable comment this year as the sugar beet fields. This crop used to be one of the big crops grown in the Nyssa section, but due to the ravages of the white fly, the acreage of beets grew smaller and smaller, finally ceasing altogether. For several years there were no beets grown here.

Last year Mr. Zesiger of the Kingman Colony district grew a field of beets, using the newly developed white fly resistant strain of beets. This experiment proved to be a success and a good crop of beets was harvested. Farmers became interested, and the Amalgamated Sugar Company of Twin Falls, Idaho became even more interested in Nyssa as a sugar beet growing section.

This year we find in excess of 750 acres between Adrian and Weiser, with over 500 of these acres close to Nyssa. Sugar beet growers and men connected with the factory have visited the fields here and have stated time after time that they saw no damage by the white fly and that the beets here were the equal and in some cases, the superior of any beets they had seen.

When we speak of the superior field, we speak of the beets being grown by Bill DeGroff. He has over 100 acres in this crop and men who have seen the fields all over the Amalgamated territory say that Bill has the best field they have seen. There are those who will wager that the entire acreage will yield in excess of 25 tons to the acre, which is a tremendous yield over such a large field.

Present indications are that the price of beets this fall will reach \$7.00 a ton, and probably exceed this figure. At this price, a yield of from 10 to 12 tons is profitable. Indeed, the country's average is only 9.6 tons to the acre, and the average price received between 1930 and 1934 was \$5.92 per ton, his made a gross return of \$56 per acre. A farmer who raises a 15 ton crop at the average price received a gross return of \$88 per acre. There are not many crops with such a record.

Beet men say the time is past when the white fly can harm the beets, as far as fly damage is concerned, growing of beets is a proven crop this year. Growers from other beet growing sections have been reported as stating that already the tonnage in some of the Nyssa fields will equal what others expect to harvest in October.

Next year there will no doubt be a big acreage of beets planted in the Nyssa section. The price of course is probamatically, but farmers can keep in mind that this country consumes about six million tons of sugar annually. Only about one-fourth of this is produced within the United States, from both cane and sugar beets.

Nyssa is particularly fortunate in having a large percentage of farmers who are interested in the so called "row crop" type of farming. It is this type of farmer who grows the big acreage of beets and makes prosperity for himself and his community.

With the development of the beet growing industry at Nyssa we can also expect a stock feeding program to keep pace with the growing of beets. Beet tops, and later on, beet pulp, molasses, and other by-products will be utilized to fatten cattle in the feed lots. We would humbly suggest that farmers of this district watch the development of beets this year, and if they are satisfied, to carefully weigh the possibility of turning a part of their acreage to beets each year.
