**4-H CLUB MEMBERS WILL HAVE GOOD EXHIBIT AT STATE FAIR AT SALEM**

Salem—"Everything indicates that 4-H boys and girls will have the biggest exhibit in history for the Diamond Jubilee Oregon state fair." H. C. Seymour of Corvallis, state 4-H club leader, has informed State Fair Director Solon T. White. The state fair will open at Salem Labor day, September 7 and close the following Sunday night.

Eastern Oregon 4-H'ers are coming to the fair with larger exhibits than ever, and will make competition stronger at the Diamond Jubilee for western Oregon boys and girls. Seymour and L. J. Allen, assistant state club leader, found on a recent trip into eastern Oregon.

The 4-H youngsters have their own large exhibit building and four livestock barns on the fairgrounds, and in addition a dormitory in which the two outstanding boys and two outstanding girls in club work in each county reside during the fair week.

Besides exhibits of club work, these youngsters carry on a full program of contests and competitive demonstrations. Among the finales to fair week for them is announcement of the Isaac Lee Patterson cup winner, who last year was Chris Starr of Yamhill county, and selection of the two outstanding boys and girls from each county, these awards held at conclusion of the 1935 fair by Clayton Fox and Troy Becker, both of Union county; Lucille Matteson, Portland; and Frances Calef, Lane county.

The fair will award several thousand dollars in premiums for the 4-H youths, and in addition will give more than 100 scholarship to the 4-H summer school held annually at Corvallis.
