Many car have owners already indicated an eagerness for low numbers for their 1937 license plates and a number of applications are now on file in the office of Secretary of State Earl Snell. Such requests received at this time are filed for the drawing to be held the last of November. The 1937 plates will be white numerals on a black background.

Tourists are on the move and during the first nine months of 1936, an additional 33,833 non-resident motor vehicles were registered in Oregon. In September, 15,595 tourists were checked at the non-resident bureaus.

Opposition to the Oregon State Bank Bill is growing, the latest being the organization of a committee of former residents of North Dakota, who have banded together to oppose the bill. North Dakota is the state which learned by bitter experience that banking had better be left to bankers and not politicians. Large losses were sustained in North Dakota, and had to be made up by taxation of the public.

Listening to political radio speeches is one of the great indoor sports these days, and Nyssa people hurry home each evening in order to tune in on their favorite spellbinder. Out of the mass of charges and counter charges, this statement seems to fit the case better than anything we have heard or read: "While spending billions of dollars of borrowed money may create a temporary appearance of prosperity, we and our children as taxpayers, have yet to pay the bill. For every single dollar spent we will pay back two dollars." Now there is the whole argument in a nutshell, as we see it.

Ballots for absentee voters are now ready for mailing from the clerk's office. These ballots must be returned to the office at least six days before the election November 3. Every citizen should exercise his franchise, and if you expect to be absent on election day, be sure to write for an absentee ballot at once.
