**PHEASANT CLUB RECEIVES 400 HATCHING EGGS**

The Oregon Trail Pheasant club received a shipment of 400 Chinese pheasant eggs this week from the State Game Commission, and these eggs are now set under hens. This is the only pheasant club Malheur county and one of the very few of the state.

When the young birds are hatched out and started on the road to maturity, the state buys them from the club at the rate of 75c each. The club this year is an experiment by the game department, and if successful the plan will be extended next year.

**LA GRANDE SHIPS MOST LADAK SEED**

La Grande—The Blue Mountain Seed Growers association of La Grande, which handles Ladak alfalfa, crested wheat grass and other seeds, has completed a successful marketing season. While many larger commercial seed houses have had difficulty in moving Ladak alfalfa because many people are yet unacquainted with it, the Blue Mountain association, which had more Ladak seed to sell than any other agency in the United States, disposed of it easily and at a considerable premium over other alfalfas, it is reported. The association sold seed to every state in the west and made small shipments to foreign countries.
