stunts are presented right in front of the eyes of the crowd at 300 or 400 feet, so that they can actually look into the open cockpit.

An all metal specially-built stunt plane, low wing design, will be used by Mr. Rankin on the tour. It is the same ship which he used in winning the world's championship at St. Louis.

Expert fliers who know the difficulty of making these maneuvers appear graceful and complete will join with the laymen in marvelling at Tex Rankin's precision in stunting—the goal of all stunt fliers. A wide variety of stunts makes his show of championship calibre. Upside-down flying with many of his most difficult maneuvers performed while hanging head down against his safety belt, is one of Tex Rankin's specialties. In upside-down stunting the pilot must do everything exactly opposite from stunting right side up.
