

Fishing Conditions

DESCHUTES RIVER—Fly fishing very materially improved due to cutting down the water turned into the river from Crane Prairie.

METOLIUS RIVER—Nice catches of fair to large rainbows are now being made on a very small grey fly.

EAST LAKE—Limit catches being made also on troll and bait.

PAULINA LAKE—Substantially the same as East. Excellent fly fishing is being had on the big shoal on the north side of the lake.

ELK LAKE—Reports from here indicate that fly fishing is very good of an evening for both brooks and rainbows and that fine large fish are being taken on trout orenó, wobbler or spoon and worm.

SUTTLE LAKE—Again perking up after a period of inactivity. A three pound rainbow was reported on a fly last week with a fair catch of smaller ones.

SOUTH TWIN LAKE—Again some of the big fellows are starting to rise to a fly. A tourist was in yesterday who reported taking a rainbow that tipped the scale at over four pounds.

DIAMOND LAKE—Very good, both on fly and troll; nice large rainbows.

DAVIS LAKE—Still producing big rainbows on fly.

CRESCENT LAKE—Have found only one man who has fished Crescent during the past few days. He didn't have much luck. We believe, however, that some nice fish can be taken on either fly or troll.

On Eastern Brook lakes, the season will close on September 20 and from past experience, we can state definitely that the fishing will steadily improve up to that time.
