Migratory Bird Law

Compiled for the readers of the 'Journal' from the official synopsis of the Oregon Hunting Laws:

UPLAND GAME BIRDS

Chinese Pheasants-Open season October 15 to 31, both dates inclusive, in Clatsop, Columbia, Washington, Yamhill, Polk Benton, Lane Linn, Douglas, Coos, Josephine, Jackson, Marion, Clackamas, Multnamah, Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Klamath, Wheeler, Merrow, Umatilla, Wallowa, Union, Baker, Grant, Crook and Deschutes Counties.

Open season October 1 to October 31, both dates inclusive in Malheur county

Open season October 20, October 23. October 27 and October 30, only between one-half hour before sunrises and the hour of sunset in Harney county, with a bag limit of three male pheasants on each of the four hunting days.

Bag Limit-Two male birds in any 1 day but not more than 4 male birds in any seven cosnecutive days in Clatsop, Columbia, Washington, Yamhill, Polk, Benton, Lane, Linn, Douglas, Coos, Josephine Jackson, Marion, Clackamas and Multnomah counties, and 4 male birds in any 1 day but not more than 3 male birds in any 7 consecutive days in Klamath, Hood River Wacso, Sherman, Gilliam, Wheeler, Morrow, Umatilla, Wallowa, Union Baker, Grant Crook, Deschutes and Malheur counties.

MIGRATORY BIRDS

Band-Tailed Pigeons-Open sea son October 16 to October 30, both dates inclusive. Bag Limit: 10 in any one day, and not more than 10 in contest sponsored by The First possession at any one time.

Ducks, Geese, Brant, Coot, Wilson Snipe or Jacksnipe-Opin season season November 1 to November 30, both dates inclusive. No open season for Ross's geese, wood ducks, ruddy ducks, canvasback ducks, swans redhead ducks, bufflehead ducks and oves.

Bag Limit: Ducks, ten in the aggregate of all kinds in any one day and not more than 10 in the aggregate of all kinds in possession at any one time. Geese and Brant-Five in the aggregate of all kinds in any one day, and not more than five in the aggregate of all kinds in possession at any one time. Coot-Twenty-five in any one day, and not more than 25 in possession at any one time. Wilson Snipe or Jacksnipe -Fifteen in any one day, and no more than 15 in possesison at any

Feedig or Baiting-Waterfowl are not permitted to be taken with or by aid of corn, wheat, oats, or other grain or products thereof or by any kind of feed by whomsoever, or for whatsoever purpose, placed in any environment whatsoever.

Waterfowl Decoys-It shall be unlawful to use directly or indirectly live waterfowl decoys for the taking

Shooting Time-It shall be unlawful to hunt or take ducks, geese, brant or coot except from 7 . 4 p. m., standard time, during the open sesson. Wilson snips or jacksnipe and band-tailed pigeons may be taken from 7 a. m. to sunset dur-
