NYSSA-VALE FOOTBALL GAME
The Nyssa-Vale football game October 20 which ended in a 6-6 tie on the local gridiron was fast and the most exciting game of the season. Both teams were evenly matched and keyed up to a high pitch of excitement.
Stanley Ray and Gene Gaston interchanged during the game and proved to be a good running combination.
Early in the first quarter, a long run by Ray put the ball on Vale's 7 1/2 yard line; but Nyssa failed to put it over. Vale received the ball and punted. Nyssa again received the ball but failed to make yardage. They punted and recovered the punt and made 15 yards on a pass in the next play.
Vale recovered the fumble in the next play and made a 20 yard gain. They were unable to make any more yardage before the half.
