T.B. Threatens Young Women

Leading Statistician States Latest Facts On This Serious Situation

"Leading tuberculosis authorities call tuberculosis the foe of youth,' says Miss Jessamine S. Whitney, statistician of the National Tuber culosis, "but I go even further and call it the foe of girls and young women. Why? Because the deaths from tuberculosis among them are one and one-half times as many as those among their brothers of the same age."

The death rate from tuberculosis has been cut to less than one-third of what it was thirty years ago when it was the leading cause of death. Yet when we analyze these deaths we find that tuberculosis is still the leading cause of death for men and women between 15 and 45 years of age and we also find that among young women between 15 and 30 one in every four deaths is from this highly contagious disease. Miss Whitney in answering why tuberculosis is twice as prevalent among young women as among young men says, "No one knows. Today it is an outstanding mystery

in public health." In an attempt to solve this mystery the National Tuberculosis Association made a careful study of the life histories of all girls between 15 and 25 who died from tubercu-
