When they are registered in this area, the brain mechanisms get busy and send secondary signals to other areas over the integrating, or intercommunication systems in the thalamus, the white matter in the frontal lobes and other structures having similar purpose.

81 Miles of Boxed Fruit Sold Through One Auction in a Few Hours!

NEW YORK CITY.—Visualize ten rows of boxed citrus and deciduous fruits laid end to end stretching across the entire length of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay bridge; or, thirteen tiers of the same fruit-filled containers piled flat one upon another reaching into the sky as high as Mount Whitney or Mount Rainier. In other words, a single line of boxes packed with oranges, grapes, pears, apples, peaches, pomegranates, plums, persimmons, grapefruit, pineapples and other fruits, reaching lengthwise for a distance of eighty-one miles; or, a single pile penetrating the stratosphere to an altitude of thirty-seven miles!

That gives some idea of the tremendous volume of these fruits that were sold through the New York Fruit Auction in New York City in a few hours' time on a recent Monday.

The one day's sale comprised 238,000 boxes, crates and lugs of fruit, which were received in 379



refrigerator cars. Products from California, Oregon and Washington included in this sale were: 100,656 lugs of grapes; 28,101 boxes of pears; 14,882 boxes of apples; 15,238 boxes of oranges; 4,466 boxes of lemons; 3,200 crates of figs; 1,162 crates of plums; 1,116 lugs of pomegranates; 1,377 lugs of olives; 3,923 boxes of persimmons; 1,127 boxes of peaches, and 917 lugs of quinces.

Extraordinary? Not at all. Just an average Monday's sale through that auction during this season of the year, which makes it obvious that New Yorkers and Brooklynites relish California and Pacific Northwest fruits.
