Notice to Property Owners

IN PROPOSED SEWER EXTENSION DISTRICT NO. 3.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN To all property owners and all persons interested in the lands and premises to be benefited thereby, that the City Council of the City of Nyssa has adopted a resolution providing for the creation of Sewer Improvement District No. 3, and the construction therein of extensions to the present sewer system, providing therein for the assessment of the cost thereof against the property to be benefited thereby, which resolution is numbered 39, and entitled: "A Resolution providing for the extension of the present sewer-line from the terminus on Second Street easterly thru the alley in Blocks 13 and 14 of the original townsite and westerly from the present terminus on Second Street thru the alley in Block 15, Original Townsite and Blocks Three and Four Teutsch's Addition; providing for the assessment of the cost thereof against the property to be benefited thereby and providing for notice to the property owners and a time for hearing of remonstrances thereto; providing the means of collecting and enforcing payment of said assessments, and creating Sewer Improvement District No. 3."

A public hearing will be held by the Common Council in the basement of the Eagles Hall on Friday evening, April 15, 1938, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. at which time and place all property owners and others interested may appear and present their reasons for or against said proposed extension and improvements.

Unless two thirds of the property owners affected thereby file with the Recorder, on or before the time of said hearing, written protests against the doing of said construction work, the Council will proceed with said construction work. Plans and specifications with an estimate of the cost are now on file with the City Recorder, and are open to the inspection of the public.
