C. C. Wyckoff of Buena Vista planned to visit with A. A. Bratton Sunday afternoon but on arriving

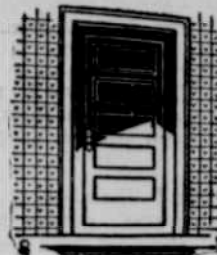
found they had gone to Emmett for the day.
