Clyde Long local trapper for the U. S. biological survey has been busy this past week eliminating some of the beaver population in this area. Due to distress calls from several of the land owners along the river. As these aquatic rodents were destroying too large a portion of the timber thereabouts. Some even went so far as to interfere with a water pump, cutting willows and stopping it faster than the owner could get it in order again.

On Tuesday of this week in less than 24 hours Mr. Long got four of the busy fellows. Two just west of the railroad bridge on the Snake south of Nyssa and two along the Owyhee. But from all evidence there are more yet to be taken and the traps are still set.

Mr. Long is trapping with live traps, which means that the animals are captured alive and painlessly without injury. After being caught they are taken to the state game farm where they are held and later sent out to different territories where the beavers activities are needed. It is also illegal to dispose of or to possess the hide of a beaver that does not bear the federal stamp which stops the wholesale destruction of the little animals in this country.
