WOULD THIS SOLVE OUR ROAD PROBLEM

It has been the writers privilege to set in on many a meeting held by the county court and to have listened to delegation after delegation ask the court for either new roads or re-paving those already existing.

Much hope had been built up, throughout the county, over the road bonds voted last spring. But that is past now, the Supreme Court ruling them illegal, leaving the county road funds as they were before—with not enough to do the work in as short a time as would have been under the bonds.

No one will blame those delegations for trekking to the court. A trip over most any farm road in the county would leave no doubt in anyones mind of the justification for the request of these delegations—the bad road condition is not only in one locality—impassable or nearly impassable roads are a curse in every community in the county.

All of these delegations take up the time of our county court, time that is given ungrudgingly, no matter how much other pressing business is to come up—relief, weed control county W.P.A., probate matters, to name but a few.

One of the worst results of these delegations is the feeling that one community is favored over another—a thing that is only natural to crop up. To offset all of this we have been pondering the subject of three or four road districts in the county. Malheur county lends itself, geographically, to such a division. With the creation of these road districts, the county court would have more time to devote to other matters of county business, and upon each district would be the responsibility of getting the most out of the money raised in that district.

Judge Graham, not so long ago indicated that he would favor such a move, so that there should not be any opposition from our county court.

It would seem to us that the proposition is now up to the various Granges, Chambers of Commerce and other organized bodies to discuss the matter among their members and decide if the roads in Malheur county could be put into better shape under the suggested plan, than that of the present county-wide road district. The county court has a lot of road equipment on hand—equipment that could be sold to the road districts—thus relieving the court of whatever financial obligation it may have assumed for the equipment.

The old slogan with which we became so familiar during the repeal campaign that "You Can't Make a Man Good by Law" is being proven by Idaho's law that prohibits selling cigarettes on Sunday. The boys (and girls too) just will smoke, regardless.

Will some bright member explain why it is so much more important to protect South America from the foul designs of Germany than it is to see that Europe is not swallowed up by that national monstrosity.

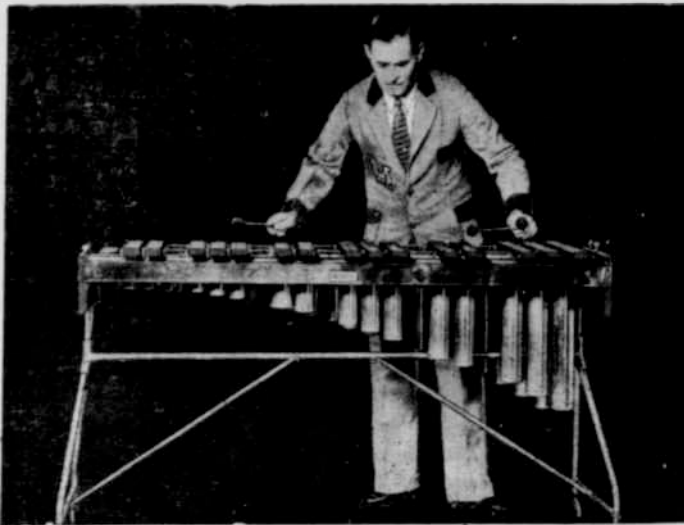
