MUTINY ON THE BOUNTY

(APOLOGIES TO "BUGS" BAER)

WITHIN the past week or ten days the nation has been faced with what is perhaps one of the most unique relief problems in our history.

The Workers Alliance has issued strike orders against the increase in hours required by W.P.A. workers.

To our mind these relief workers have lost sight of the reason for the existence of this "made work." In the first place a person on W.P.A. must be a "reliever"—he is passed on by the county relief committees, as to his need for relief (charity, it used to be called). W.P.A. is not intended as a permanent employment. And on this latter problem it might be noted that an order from Administrator Harrington says that those on W.P.A. for eighteen months must take a furlough. It does not look as if a person on relief for eighteen months could keep from getting some outside work.

And there is another side to this "strike"—we are going to hear a lot of talk about Congress being responsible for this increase in hours. Such however is not the case—the new bill governing W. P. A. was drafted and presented by W. P. Administrator Harrington, a Democratic Bureau head. Washington is the scene of a lot of "buck passing" and we cannot hope to have it otherwise in this case. Sure Congress passed the bill, but one of the "powers behind the throne" was responsible for its content—now let the responsibility rest where it belongs.

OREGON HIGH AS SUGAR STATE

Sugar beet growers in the Owyhee reclamation project produced 16.2 tons an acre on 17,000 acres last year, the highest production in the United States save one spot in northern California.

The new \$2,500,000 refinery of the Amalgamated Sugar company at Nyssa set a record, on its first 112-day sugar campaign, of 750,000 bags of sugar, 100,000 higher than expectations. In addition, the company fed beet pulp to 8000 head of cattle, as a demonstration in pulp feeding for Nyssa-Vale district farmers.

Oregon's co-operative experiment in sugar beet raising and sugar manufacturing is an unqualified success. Both the growers and the company are in the black in the first year of operation. Four hundred persons were given employment in the factory during the sugar campaign. Almost \$1,000,000 in assessed valuation was added to the tax base.

Despite all this, and the fact that America must import a large portion of its sugar from Cuba, the Philippines and elsewhere, the AAA crop control program threatens to reduce the Owyhee beet acreage from 17,000 to 12,000 this year.

Actually, on the basis of demonstrated performance and need, acreage in the Nyssa-Vale area should be stepped up to 30,000 and another refinery unit added. If Secretary Wallace reduces acreage instead, Oregon residents can charge an unwarranted interference with a necessary, successful industry.—Oregon Journal.
