

WITH THE MALHEUR COUNTY FARMERS

GAIN SEEN IN FARM PRICES

Increased production and a somewhat higher general price level compared with 1938 will make Oregon's cash farm income for 1939 larger than last year, although not as large as in 1937, according to L. R. Brethaupt, extension agricultural economist at Oregon State college. Oregon's cash farm income in 1938 was estimated at \$104,300,000 and at \$131,400,000 in 1937.

This information is contained in the October monthly review of the agricultural situation issued by the extension service, which also contains reports on market prospects for apples, potatoes and turkeys. Copies may be obtained free.

Despite some recession during recent weeks, the Oregon index of the general level of farm prices has moved up substantially as a result of sharp price advances in most of the principal farm products from mid-August to mid-September. The Oregon farm price index gained nine points during this period, bringing the general price level considerably above a year ago. On the whole, it seems probable that the general average of farm prices in Oregon during the full year, 1939, will be around 4 per cent above the rather low average for 1938, according to the report.

Farm costs have advanced also, but not yet as much as the advance in prices for farm products. The current exchange value of farm products generally for the things farmers must buy is given at 86 per cent of the 1926-1930 level, which represents a six-point gain during the past three months, bringing the purchasing power of farm commodities back in line with a year ago.

Looking ahead, it is pointed out that "some portion of the advance in prices for farm products from mid-August to mid-September was due to war demand speculation rather than entirely to actual increase in domestic consumer demand," judging from the reversal that occurred since mid-September. The report states, however, that the "prospects continue favorable for further moderate gains in industrial activity in the United States."

"It would be easy, however," the report continues, "to over-emphasize the effects of the European war upon prices for farm products in this country, as the duration of the conflict is extremely uncertain and the record of the World War of 25 years ago shows that no material change occurred in the general level of farm prices in this country until after the war had been in progress for approximately two years."

COW HOLLOW

By The Happy Farmer

George Haycock was up Cow Hollow the other day and handed us Cow Hollowites a very nice compliment. He said, "You fellows have sure made a wonderful improvement in your little hollow in the last two and one half years."

Well, it has taken a whole lot of hard work but it is worth it. It is doubtful if we can improve it as much in the next two and one half years as in the past. Still, every neighbor you talk to is going to break up some clover or alfalfa ground for row crops next year.

Chet Sage has some of the best of bottom land he expects to break out of alfalfa next year and put into beets. Jim Trummel has twenty or thirty acres of clover land to plow and put into spuds, beans and corn. Doc Raffington, Clarence Niccum and Dale Limbaugh all have clover land that must be plowed up next year and most all of it will go into row crops. Most all row crops on clover or alfalfa land is almost sure to start the cash coming back into Cow Hollow. Paul Ransom over in Sunset Valley plowed up quite a lot of clover ground this year and wheat and barley more than doubled the yield it made the first year before put into clover. His beans raised on

clover ground this year, made him around fifty dollars per acre.

The last two and one half years we lived in shacks and cleared land and seeded clover and alfalfa. Maybe the next two and one half years we can raise better crops and build homes, barns, poultry houses, pastures and get our farms free from tumbleweeds and mortgages.

Cow Hollow still has some crops to harvest yet. Bill Parker cut his alfalfa seed Monday. Chet Sage still has some alfalfa seed to cut and Jim Trummel has clover seed to cut and spuds to dig and there is several patches of corn that won't be ready to gather for some time yet.

Elza Niccum and Don Parker are over near Notus, Idaho, topping beets. Jim Trummel and Clarence Niccum both want to go to work in the beets just as soon as they can. Doc Raffington is running a race with time trying to get all the water stored for winter stock water that he can.

Frank Parker, Mort Wixon and Jim Trummel all have new cisterns for holding winter water. And it is reported that Chuck Share has made a large cistern, too.

All us Cow Hollowites were glad to have the water left in the canal another week and most all of them have ordered a head of water and are wetting some hay or clover land.

Sam Cates has returned from Oklahoma. He brought back a panel car or light truck and some more of his relatives.

Sam thinks that Cow Hollow is so far ahead of those old drouth

countries that he likes to bring all those that he can out here where they can "make a living."

There have been several truckloads of this Owyhee pipe line lumber come up the Cow Hollow trail for our neighboring farmers. Doc Raffington said "If it had not been for our improved road it would not have been possible for us to get that lumber so cheap."

Jack Parker has gone to the hills after another load of poles and Dude and Dick Parker are stacking Mort Wixon's alfalfa seed for the chaff after he has threshed the seed out of it.

Elza Niccum lost a horse last Sunday a week ago with brain fever. She was 23 years old but still a good worker.
