ANOTHER JOURNAL PROGRAM TAKES SHAPE

At the top of this column, we have carried as part of our program, a co-operative marketing association for Malheur county farmers. Credit must go to the Malheur County Farm Bureau for really getting the idea started, when at a meeting in Ontario this week, sponsored by the Bureau, the first step was taken toward the formation of such a co-operative.

It now remains with the row-crop farmers of the county to make this undertaking a success—for upon them will fall the task of growing the products for the co-operative, and then when the products are ready for market—to stay by their marketing agreement with the co-operative. There may be some skeptics who will say that the idea will never be successful, but we will take issue with that for we believe that the farmer is beginning to find out that without organization he is at the mercy of farm produce marketing "riggers," who give the farmer little or nothing for his products and then makes a handsome profit out of the consumer—with the inevitable result that most metropolitan residents think that the American farmer is holding them up on the necessities of life.

This marketing idea opens up a field of thought that would fill a book, but one seems to stand out—if this farm marketing co-operative is supported by our farmers it will mean a larger return on their products, and a better product to the consumer.

Again, congratulations to the Farm Bureau for the inauguration of an idea that will mean dollars in the pockets of our farmers, the Lord knows they need something to rattle in their pockets besides a jack knife and a few washers.

A DICTATOR IS "BORN"

ONE of our "good neighbors" in South America is the latest country to join the ranks of the dictators—Paraguay.

The significant part of the announcement of President Estigarribia, in establishing the dictatorship was that he was assuming all political powers in order to secure "order, peace and prosperity for the nation." That phrase is the cut and dried statement of every potential dictator. All dictatorships, it seems, is like a slow-growing paralysis—first, a showing that big businesses are economic royalists—then the second phase seems to be that of rabble rousing—pitting class against class, stirring up labor strife and the last, getting as many people as possible on the public payrolls or doles. The remaining step, to follow the modern pattern, is to tell the people that they are being oppressed, that their liberties are being taken away from them by self-centered groups, and for that reason a dictatorship must be inaugurated in order to "free" them from the so-called tyranny which was their freedom under constitutional government.
