THE DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION (?) lost
not a few of its most ardent supporters among
news columnist — due principally to the cut and
dried manner in which President Roosevelt was
nominated to the precedent smashing third term.
Even the well written and widely read magazine
"TIME" played up the steam roller method used.
The biggest man to come out of the convention
(?) was genial Jim Farley, the man who originally
"made" Roosevelt. There is doubt if
Roosevelt's talk to the convention softened the
blow of the shabby way in which Farley was
relegated to the limbo of forgotten men. About
the cleverest piece of politics coming out of the
convention (?) was this speech which Roosevelt
said that he was going to be busy looking
after the nations affairs in Washington that
he would not be able to conduct a campaign.
If our memory serves us right, "Genial Jim"
did the most of the campaigning last time. And
Secretary of Agriculture Wallace being named
as nominee for the vice-presidency was as obvious
a bit of politics as could be imagined (we
wonder if Senator McNary being on the Republican
ticket had anything to do with it?)

THE SUCCOR CREEK ROAD is now coming
up for attention, thanks to our county judge and
commissioners, who have asked that the State
Highway Department take this road over as a
secondary highway — a thing that should have
been done long ago and which has been advocated
by this newspaper for just as long. There
is ample reason for this road being in the Highway
system of the state. In the first place it
will give to our farmers, a shorter, faster and
less expensive road, over which to transport
their products to that vast market in California,
and will be a direct tie-up with the Idaho-Nevada-
Oregon cut-off which is now one of the main
travelled roads from Idaho and this section of
Oregon to California. And by having this road
in first class shape will eliminate the necessity
of extra licenses, which is required of trucks
operating in Idaho. In other words it would be
Oregon, Nevada and California licenses that
would be required.

THE NYSSA UNDERPASS may be properly
termed another accomplishment of the
Nyssa Chamber of Commerce. By this we do
not mean that there was any strings attached
to the Highway Commission, but rather that
through the efforts of the Chamber of Commerce
the urgency of the need for the underpass was
brought to the commissions attention with the
result that the construction will start sometime
within the next thirty days. Three delegations
appeared before the commission, the expense
of which was borne by the Chamber. And
there has been many an anxious moment, moments
when it looked as if the project would be
lost and always some way was worked out of
the difficulty, which should prove that our
Chamber of Commerce is an organization of
which to be proud. The injunction? Well that
seems to be a minor thing, although it could tie
up the construction for a while, but there seems
little likelihood that this situation will do any
more than cause a delay.

PACKING SHEDS are springing up thick as
mushrooms in an around Nyssa. Which should
bring us to the realization that our section is
fast coming into it's own as a row-crop country.
These row-crops should, if properly handled
prove a real money maker for our farmers and
bring them from under the constant threat of
the ever present surplus of grain crops. If we
could only devise some scheme in which we
could show interested parties, that our section
offers other golden opportunities—canneries
and a condensary or creamery. Canneries
would offer our farmers early cash crops and a
condensary or creamery would afford a year-
round payroll for them. Anyway it's nice to
day dream about the possibilities. We have
the nucleus of a potential dairying country and
our farmers and land are the best to be found
anywhere.
