GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP, of everything under the sun, seems to be the growing tendency in this country. Part of this tendency seems to grow out of the bigness of a company or industry, the proponents forgetting that this is the first step toward state totalitarianism—toward the government ownership of the "small" business man and even the farmers. Examples? Look over Russia, Germany and Italy. Do the farmers of those countries enjoy the freedom of marketing and growing their crops—of course not. And if this government ownership propaganda goes on much longer in this country we are going to wake up some day and find ourselves in the same fix.

Our own national history was started through the wish for free enterprise, for freedom of thought and action. The mere fact that the government sets itself up in business is no assurance that we are going to get a product any cheaper than if it were manufactured by a private concern, for governmental bureaus are composed of human beings—subject to the same shortcomings as those who head private industries. And these governmental bureaus are just as anxious to perpetuate themselves in office as the private business man is anxious to keep his business going, or the farmer to run his farm as he wants it run. It is rather amusing to hear these men from Washington, on the staff of this and that bureau, beating their breast and crying crocodile tears over the plight of the poor down trodden people—if they were not for the job they were holding would they devote their time and efforts to whatever cause they are trying to promulgate? We doubt it—they are holding down a job—in most cases overpaid for it too—paid for by the taxpayers of this nation, a large part of which is made up of the very element in our national life that they are trying to do away with.

If it is control of the earnings of bigness that these proponents of government ownership are after—or the abolishment of holding companies—why not set up such a control. In our mind there is little justification for holding companies, except that industry must find some place to borrow money, and the holding companies offer that source. But as far as putting the government in business to control the holding company situation is a lot like cutting off your arm at the shoulder because a finger is infected.
