Don Diefendopfer of Caldwell and John Parker of Nyssa called on the U. E. Parker family Sunday morning in time for breakfast.

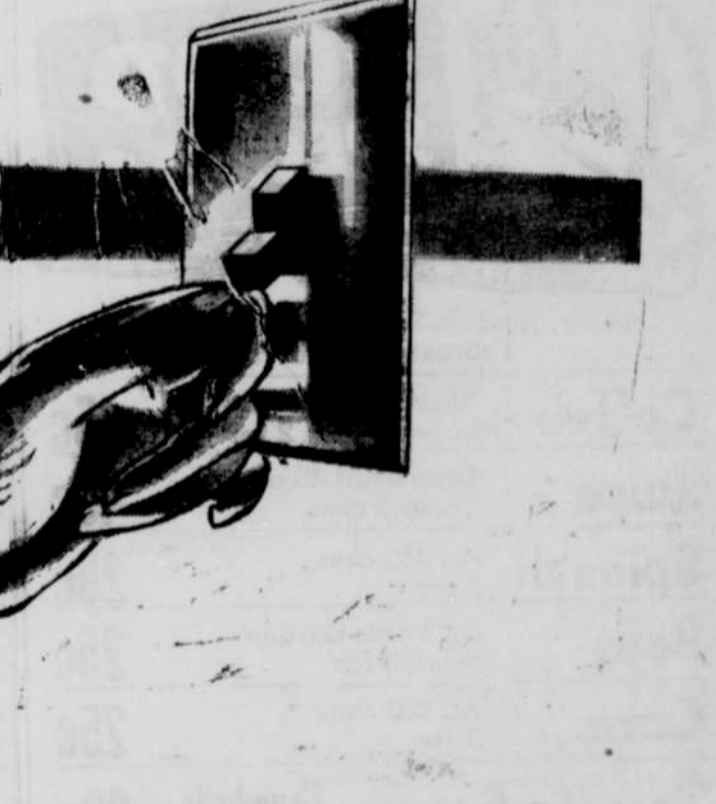
Our station librarian reports a new supply of books. She has some of the books that were requested.
